### **BEAULIEU MOTOR MUSEUM, PALACE HOUSE & GARDENS**

*31 July*

A visit to Beaulieu is a great day for all the family this historic estate offers a viewing of the Montagu family home, which has been owned by the family since 1538, the ruins of the Abbey that Henry VIII had destroyed and of course the National Motor Museum. Over 250 vehicles tell the story of motoring on the roads and circuits of Britain, from pioneering origins to the present day. The stylish, the elegant, the fast, the famous and the plain functional are all on show at what is the most well renowned motor museum in the UK. Our visit coincides with ‘Simply Japanese’ day.

### **LULWORTH CASTLE & COVE**

*09 August*

Lulworth Castle was built in the early 17<sup>th</sup> century as a hunting lodge. The exterior has changed little over the years but the interior was gutted by a disastrous fire in 1929. Work has been carried out to consolidate the interior and the public can now visit the Castle, climb the tower, visit the stunning C18th Roman Catholic Chapel of St Mary and C15th Church of St Andrew before visiting the Jurassic Coast’s beautiful Lulworth Cove.

### **RHS GARDEN WISLEY**

## **ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS & PALACE KEW**

*29 May, 14 August*

Historically significant for its association with the Royal family, Kew Palace (formerly known as the Dutch House) is the earliest surviving building in the Gardens. Built around 1631 by Samuel Fortrey, a merchant of Dutch origin, it is noted for its decorative carved brickwork and rounded gables. Kew Palace is in the trust of Historic Royal Palaces. The ground and first floor rooms have been lovingly restored to their opulent Georgian splendour, while the second floor has remained in an untouched state for centuries.

Kew Gardens, three hundred acres of magnificent gardens and 6 acres of exotic glasshouses, offer plenty to see whatever the weather.

### ARUNDEL

*24 September*

Among the six acres of gardens on Angel Hill behind the gate house is the Appleby Rose Garden a monument to the USAAF men who served in the second world war. Two of the old monastic churches remain, St James's (now the cathedral) and St Mary's Church where you can find the grave of Mary Tudor, sister of Henry VIII.

Situated right opposite the Swindon Designer Outlet, the museum tells the story of the men and women who built, operated and travelled on the Great Western Railway, often referred to by historians and railway fans as 'God's Wonderful Railway'. The pioneering vision and engineering genius of Isambard Kingdom Brunel led to the Great Western Railway network becoming regarded as the most advanced in the world.
